VH-SAR/Tony Marshall (contact above Winston Churchill)

Search and Rescue. Tony Marshall.

Hello Tony. It's Adrian Sierra Alpha Romeo.

Yes. Go ahead.

We're overhead a vessel we believe to be the Winston Churchill. It's in distress. It has no mast. There's people on the deck. We're overhead this time and there's apparently a rescue boat on its way.

A rescue boat is there?

Yep. Mike Whisky Kilo Rescue 1 end of call sign. When you're ready I'll go ahead a position.

OK and the position

37 46S 150 33E

Roger and confirm that is definitely the Winston Churchill.

Affirm.

Stand by one Sierra Alpha Romeo.

Roger. Standby.

Dick. SAR is overhead the Winston Churchill position. We think that

SAR MC advised of this information. Tape unintelligible.

Sorry Sierra Alpha Romeo. Remain over the top of the Winston Churchill.

Yep.

Do you have an estimated time of arrival of the rescue boat?

Not as yet. We can find out and get back to you with that information.,

Roger. If you would and we would... The Winston Churchill - does look like it's going to sink or remain afloat.

At this stage looks like it remains afloat. The only visible damage is the mast is missing. The mast is gone.

Roger. Thankyou.

No worries.

Right we expect to see helicopters there ... we should have helicopter in the area by about 0745 to 0750.

Roger understand. Helicopter around 0745 or 0750.

Yes.

Understood.

Roger. Thankyou.
